Will You Sign A Petition?

Early 2017, volunteers will go door-to-door in the village with two petitions. The Parish Council intends to petition Norfolk County Council and Highways to fulfil the objectives of the NDR by reducing the volume and inappropriate traffic using the village roads.



The first petition requests the restriction of Heavy Goods Vehicles from travelling through The Street and Taverham Road in both directions upon completion of the Northern Distributor Route in December 2017/Spring 2018 (whichever the soonest).

The second is to restrict Vehicle Access along Bilney Lane, Brands Lane and Church Lane to resident and business access only as soon as possible.

Both requests require us to demonstrate that there is consensus within the community to improve village life and safety by implementing these restrictions.

Community Speedwatch

Rather than complaining about speeding vehicles have you thought of doing something about it? Most of you will have seen volunteers completing speed checks in this village and surrounding areas. Next Steps



With Phase 1 complete, the Parish Council is moving ahead with the next phase of the 3-year plan. We are working with Highways to prepare a bid for Parish Partnership Funding for the installation of a third narrowing and village gateways.

Implementation will be dependent on a successful bid. The narrowing will be situated at the Horsford end of The Street near to Bilney Lane junction, and the Gateways at the boundaries of the village at both ends of The Street and on Taverham Road.

Thinking Fuel is the oil buying scheme run by
Community Action Norfolk in partnership with
Anglian Farmers-Affinity. Their aim is to try and

provide communities with cheaper fuel. Felthorpe Parish is a lifetime member of Thinking Fuel. On average, the scheme has saved members around 9% on the market price, equivalent to 6 pence per litre or £120 a year based on 2,000 litres.
