### Save a Life:

#### Bleed Control: Emergency Bleed Kit:

The parish council has bought an emergency bleed kit, at the cost of £120, which will be kept with the defibrillator at the Pavillion. The "Bleed bag" is a highly visible grab bag that is small enough to store securely and yet can be easily located. Bleed bags are specialized trauma kits designed to provide bystanders with the products they need to stop life threatening bleeding until paramedics arrive. Bleed bags contain the equipment required to manage potentially catastrophic bleeding and can be life saving.

A catastrophic bleed is defined as extreme bleeding that is likely to cause death in minutes. It usually occurs as the result of an accident or injury where an artery has been punctured.

It is not just road traffic collisions or accidents that can cause catastrophic bleeding. In 2022 a young man tragically died as a result of a stabbing incident in Norwich. He may have been saved if a bleed bag had been available to administer first aid to stem the bleeding prior to the arrival of the emergency services.

### Felthorpe Issues:

#### Action on Dog fouling

Broadland District Council has renewed the existing Public Spaces Protection Orders (PSPOs) made under section 59 of the Anti-social Behaviour, Crime and Policing Act 2014, which cover dog fouling across both district areas.

Each PSPO makes it an offence for a person in control of a dog not to clear up the dog mess immediately, on any land that is open to the air and to which the public is entitled or permitted to have access (with or without payment).

Offenders in Broadland are subject to a fixed penalty notice of £100, reduced to £80 if paid within 10 days, or if taken to court, a fine up to £1,000.

In order for an offence to be investigated, Broadland District Council will need to know the address of the owner and as much information as possible including a description of both the dog(s) and the owner.

If you see someone allowing their dog to foul and not clear it up, and if you know the owner's details you can report this using the link:

Felthorpe Parish Council have supplied dog bins at sites frequented by dog walkers including: the recreation ground, on Mill Lane, Church Lane and opposite St Margaret's church. The Parish Council pay Broadland District Council to empty the dog bins on a regular basis.

#### Drone Innovation at Felthorpe Airfield

HexCam, a Felthorpe Airfield based commercial drone operator, is on a mission to make large area construction surveys safer and quicker.

The company is one of just six in the UK to be selected by the Civil Aviation Authority (CAA) for a trial project that aims to make Beyond Visual Line of Sight (BVLOS) drone flights an "everyday reality".

The trial will enable HexCam to control drones remotely from the airfield, and carry out flights along

the onshore construction corridor of the Norfolk Offshore Wind Zone project. In the coming months you may catch a glimpse of our new white fixed wing drone as we continue testing or as it starts heading out on longer missions.
