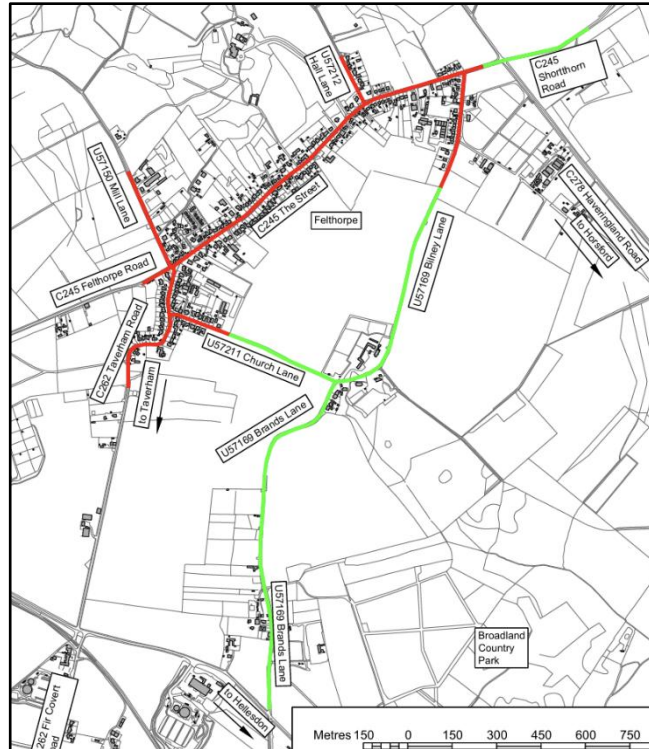

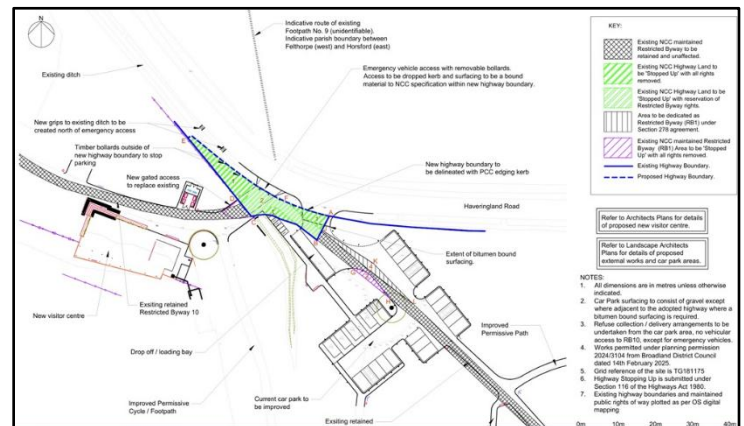


Preliminary Consultation

As part of a package of local traffic mitigation measures, Norfolk County Council is proposing changes to existing speed limits within Felthorpe. The plans PJA126- ID-003 show the extents of the speed limits being proposed. The next stage in the process will be the advertisement period for the associated Traffic Regulation Orders.

Consultation for the Stopping Up of Haveringland Road

The stopping up of the highway land on Haveingland Road will allow for the entrance to the new Broadland Visitor Centre car park to be sensitively and will help prevent informal parking by relocating vehicles to a purpose-built car park.
