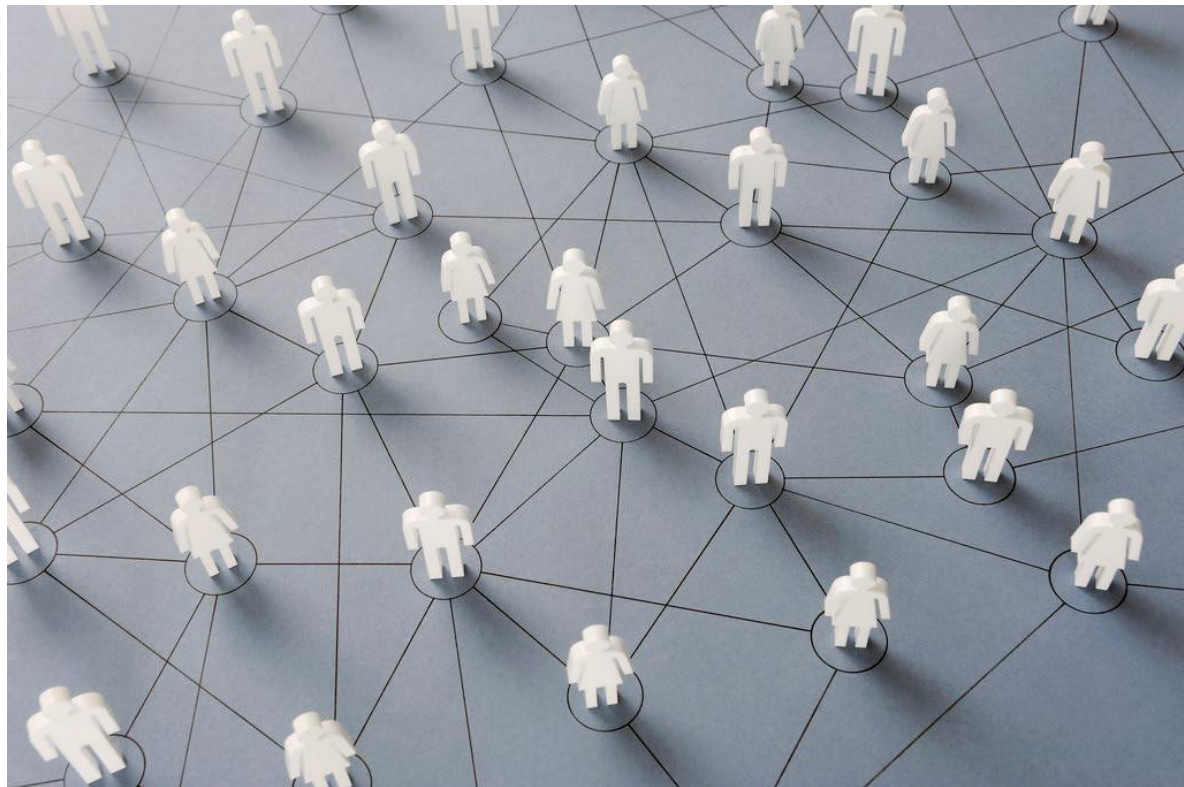

With 2023 firmly in the rear-view mirror, as we look forward to a new year, we reflect on what we achieved over the past 12 months.

The Village Sign has been given a fresh look and has been refurbished (pictured above).

Three new dog bins have been installed to, Mill Lane, by the Church on Bilney Lane, and on the footpath behind School Garage (Church Lane end).
